DC Update from Chairman Jack Basso

In 2009, the National Surface Transportation Inhastructure Financing Commission completed their work and the findings in their report could not have been clearer:

"The Commission cost a wide net, reviewed many funding alternatives, and concluded that indeed the most visible approach

to afficiently fund federal investment in surface transportation in the medium to long run will be a user charge evatern based

more directly on miles driven (and potentially on factors such as time of day, type of read, and vehicle weight and firel accessory)

rather than indirectly on five consumed."

The Commission was created by Cangress in SAPETEA-LU to prepare the way for legislative action in MAP-21 to fluid the pilet programs necessary to work through the implementation and operation issues related to a misage based for system We've been fortunate to have a former Commission member, Advisor Mission, as a member of MBUEA, and his experience and insight have been involuble to us ever the post two years.


Transportation Finance Crossroads


Federal Outlook - Moving Forward

- In December, Rep. Earl Blumenauer (D-Ore.) introduced a bill (H.R. 6662) that would require the Treasury Department to study the viability of raising new federal highway funds by taxing cars for each mile they drive
- GAO Report (Dec 2012): "Mileage Fee Could Be More "Equitable and Efficient" Than Gas Tax"
- House T&I Committee Chairman Bill Schuster: "There'll be a shorter-term fix, but longer-term, vehicle miles traveled may be the only way to stop the decline."

Member Engagement

- Members in the past year have helped shape the following:
 - Launched the MBUFA website, the only website devoted to mileage-based user fee issues in the United States
 - Published an e-newsletter three times a year
 - Attended briefings on this issue with the Congressional Budget Office, Department of Transportation, Senate Budget and EPW Committee staff, and House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee staff
